TO LIMIT DISCLOSURE OF PERSONAL INFORMATION CONTAINED IN APPLICATIONS FOR LICENSES ISSUED BY THE PRIVATE PROTECTIVE SERVICES BOARD AND THE ALARM SYSTEMS LICENSING BOARD AND TO AUTHORIZE THE ALARM SYSTEMS LICENSING BOARD TO ISSUE AN APPRENTICESHIP REGISTRATION PERMIT. Adds new GS 74C-8 and 74D-2, providing that except for administrative and law enforcement purposes, boards cited in title shall not disclose the home address or telephone number of applicants or licensees or their family members without consent, except when the person's home and business address and telephone number are the same. Adds new GS 74D-8.1, authorizing the Alarm Systems Licensing Board to issue apprenticeship registration permit to an applicant who is 16 or 17 years old, if applicant holds a driver's license and submits at least three letters of recommendation as provided in GS 74D-2(d)(2). Requires that holder of an apprenticeship permit be accompanied by a licensed or registered employee while engaging in activities authorized under the Chapter. Effective Sept. 1, 1999.
