H 1638. I/M TECHNOLOGY. Intro. 5/17/00. House committee substitute makes the following changes to 1st edition. Changes title to: TO IMPROVE AMBIENT AIR QUALITY, TO PROVIDE FOR THE USE OF ON-BOARD DIAGNOSTIC EQUIPMENT IN THE MOTOR VEHICLE EMISSION INSPECTION AND MAINTENANCE PROGRAM, AND TO EXCLUDE FEDERAL CONGESTION MITIGATION AND AIR QUALITY FUNDS FROM THE DISTRIBUTION FORMULA FOR FUNDS EXPENDED ON TRANSPORTATION, AS RECOMMENDED BY THE ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW COMMISSION. Reinstates GS 20-183.3(a)(9), regarding exhaust systems. Effective July 1, 2002, amends GS 20-183(b) to provide that if a vehicle is a 1996 or later model, it must pass either the exhaust emission analysis or the on-board diagnostic (OBD) analysis. Effective July 1, 2002, amends GS 20-183.4A. to require that an inspection station must have either an emissions analyzer or equipment to analyze data provided by OBD equipment, or both, approved by the Envr. Management Commin. Effective July 1, 2003, amends GS 20-183.4A to require that in Cabarrus, Durham, Forsyth, Gaston, Guilford, Mecklenburg, Orange, Union, and Wake counties inspection stations must have equipment approved by the Envr. Management Comm'n to analyze data from OBD equipment and a mechanic must have completed an 8-hour course in emission control devices and analysis of OBD data. Effective July 1, 2002, amends GS 20-183.8C to provide that it is a Type II offense to improperly gain access to a code to analyzed OBD data and that it is a Type III offense to fail to maintain a log for equipment to analyze OBD data. Deletes proposed fee increases.
