Senate committee substitute replaces entire 2nd edition and changes title to AN ACT TO AMEND THE DUTIES OF THE INFORMATION RESOURCE MANAGEMENT COMMISSION AND TO REQUIRE THAT CERTAIN STATE AGENCY INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY PROJECTS MUST BE CERTIFIED BY THE COMMISSION. Amends GS 143B-472.41(b) to prohibit any state agency, other than UNC and constituent institutions, from spending more than \$500,000 on any information technology project without prior certification of the Information Resource Management Comm'n.
