**H 287. CHILD CARE LAW CORRECTIONS.** Intro. 3/4/99. House committee substitute makes the following changes to 1st edition. Amends GS 110-88 to clarify that Commission has authority to require annual health and fire inspections after a license is issued, and to clarify that the Commission may not determine curriculum offered in religious-sponsored child care facilitates. Also clarifies that staff qualification requirements do not apply to religious-sponsored facilities. Deletes repeal of session law that prohibited the promotion of or requirement of use of training materials or curriculum developed by the National Association of the Education of Young Children or the National Institute of Early Childhood Professional Development. Further amends GS 110-88 to provide that (1) the Child Care Commission may not require the standards, policies, or curriculum of any single accrediting childcare organization and (2) if regulatory inquiries to providers include data base fields or questions regarding accreditation, the inquiry must permit daycare providers to fill in any accrediting organization from which they have received accreditation.
