GRANDPARENT VISITATION. *TO PROVIDE FOR AN EXPANSION OF RIGHTS UNDER EXISTING LAW PERTAINING TO GRANDPARENT VISITATION.* Amends G.S. 50-13.2A to allow a court to award visitation to grandparents upon a determination that visitation is in the best interest of the child. If the grandchild's legal parents are married and living together, no visitation may be ordered unless the court finds: (1) there is a preexisting relationship between the grandparent and the grandchild that has engendered a bond; and (2) that the amount and circumstances of visitation will not substantially interfere with the rights of the parents to exercise their parental authority. Further, when the legal parents are married and living together, there is a presumption that visitation is not in the grandchild's best interest if the grandchild's parents agree that the grandparent should not have visitation.
