H 923. LEAVE/STATE EMPLOYEES. Intro. 4/1/99. Senate committee substitute makes the following changes to 2nd edition. Changes title to "TO INCREASE STATE EMPLOYEE MINIMUM VACATION LEAVE ACCRUAL RATES AND ALLOW FOR ADVERSE WEATHER LEAVE." Amends GS 126-8 to increase vacation leave from 2 weeks to 112 hours a year, cumulative to at least 240 hours, and to increase sick leave from 10 days to 96 hours. Adds new GS 126-8.4 to provide that for nonmandatory state government operations during times of adverse weather, the State Personnel Comm'n shall establish guidelines that allow state employees to use up to a maximum of 24 hours of adverse weather leave per calendar year. When a state of emergency has been declared or declaration of disaster has been issued, the Governor may allow exceptions to the maximum of 24 hours' adverse weather leave. New GS 126-8.4 is effective when it becomes law; the amendment to GS 126-8 is effective Jan. 1, 2001.
