S 1263. CHARLOTTE WHEEL LOCKS ALLOWED. TO PERMIT THE CITY OF CHARLOTTE TO USE WHEEL LOCKS TO ENFORCE PARKING ORDINANCES. Amends the Charter of the City of Charlotte by adding two new sections. New section 6.26 (towing penalties) in Ch. VI, Subch. A, Art. II, permits the Council to provide by ordinance that any vehicle that has been towed for a parking violation be held until the towing fee and penalties relating to all outstanding parking tickets and penalties owed to the city are paid in full, or a bond is posted in an equal amount. New Section 6.27 (wheel locks permitted) permits the Council to provide by ordinance the use of wheel locks on illegally parked vehicles for which there are three or more outstanding, unpaid, and overdue parking tickets for a period of 90 days.

S 1263. CHARLOTTE WHEEL LOCKS ALLOWED. Intro. May 16, 2000. Senate committee substitute makes stylistic changes to 1st edition.

S 1263. CHARLOTTE WHEEL LOCKS ALLOWED. Intro. 5/16/00. House committee substitute makes the following changes to 2nd edition. Provides that if S 1391 or H 1667 become law, then Section 6.11 (parking regulations and violations) of the City of Charlotte Charter, as enacted by either of those bills, would be rewritten as follows. Makes clear that by ordinance the City may require that all outstanding parking tickets and penalties be paid before a towed vehicle is released. Adds as part (c) of that charter section the substance of Section 2 of this bill, permitting wheel locks.
