S 1460. FILM INDUSTRY INCENTIVES. Intro. 5/25/00. Senate committee substitute makes the following changes to 1st edition. Deletes appropriation of \$5 million from General Fund in fiscal 2000-2001 to the Dep't of Commerce, Div'n of Travel and Tourism, for the Film Industry Development Account.

June 28, 2000

S 1460. FILM INDUSTRY INCENTIVES. Intro. 5/24/00. Senate amendment makes the following changes to 2nd edition. Adds language providing that a grant may not be used for political or issue advertising. Also provides that the refund of the state sales tax does not apply to tax paid on accommodations furnished to employees for the purpose of engaging in political or issue advertising.

June 30, 2000

S 1460. FILM INDUSTRY INCENTIVES. Intro. 5/25/00. House committee substitute makes the following changes to 2nd edition. (1) Adds to new GS 143B-434.3(a) a provision that no grant made as an incentive to production companies may be used for political or issue advertising. (2) Deletes from the bill the provision adding a new GS 105-164.14 regarding a sales tax refund for sales tax paid by production companies on the rental of transient accommodations for occupancy by its employees. (3) Makes entire bill effective when it becomes law.

S 1460. FILM INDUSTRY INCENTIVES. Intro. 5/25/00. House amendment makes the following changes to 4th edition. Provides that production company is not eligible for a grant if the film contains material considered obscene within meaning of GS 14-190.1(b).
