TO PROVIDE THAT A SCHOLARSHIP STUDENT WHO ATTENDS A CONSTITUENT INSTITUTION OF THE UNIVERSITY OF NORTH CAROLINA SHALL BE TREATED AS A NORTH CAROLINA RESIDENT FOR ALL PURPOSES AND TO PROVIDE THAT A MEMBER OF THE MILITARY WHO ATTENDS A CONSTITUENT INSTITUTIon of the university of north carolina or a community college shall only be charged the in-state tuition rate. Adds new GS 116-25.1 to allow any nonresident who receives a full scholarship to and attends a constituent school of The University of North Carolina to be treated as a resident of the state. Rewrites GS 116-143.3(b) to allow nonresident members of the armed services to be charged the in-state tuition rate. Effective July 1, 1999.

**S 19. UNC TUITION/SCHOLARSHIP/MILITARY.** Intro. 2/2/99. Senate committee substitute makes the following changes to 1st edition. Amends GS 116-143.5 to provide that any nonresident person who receives a full scholarship to a constituent institution and who attends the institution shall be deemed to have made full payment of tuition costs by remitting the in-State tuition amount (was, any nonresident who receives a full scholarship and who attends the institution shall be considered and treated for all purposes as a resident of NC). Defines "full scholarship" and "full cost".

Amends GS 116-143.3(b) to provide that members of the armed services qualified under the statute that do not qualify as a resident for tuition purposes shall be charged the in-State tuition rate while abiding in this State incident to active military duty in this state (was, such personnel are eligible to be charged the in-State tuition rate).
