(e2) to provide that lessor of a space for manufactured home has lien on all furniture and other personal property including the manufactured home titled in the name of the tenant if (1) the home remains on the rented premises 21 days after lessor obtains writ of possession and (2) lessor has lawful claim for damages against tenant. If lessor has received and executed judgment for possession of premises, then all property remaining on premises may be removed and placed in storage. Before expiration of the 21-day period, landlord must release the personal property and manufactured home to tenant. Lien is for amount of rents due and for damage caused by tenant. Lien to be enforced by public sale under GS 44A-4(e).
