S 693. PROSECUTION BONDS/WHEN REQUIRED. TO PROVIDE, UPON THE MOTION OF A DEFENDANT MADE AFTER ISSUANCE OF SUMMONS, THAT A PLAINTIFF IS NOT ALWAYS REQUIRED TO POST A PROSECUTION BOND, PROVIDE SECURITY, OR SHOW THE PLAINTIFF IS SUING AS AN INDIGENT BUT TO PROVIDE THAT THE PLAINTIFF MAY BE SO REQUIRED BY THE CLERK OR JUDGE UPON A SHOWING OF GOOD CAUSE BY THE DEFENDANT. GS 1-109 provides that, upon motion of the defendant, the clerk or judge must require non-indigent plaintiffs to post bond or provide security. Act amends statute to provide that clerk or judge may, upon a showing of good cause, impose security or bond requirement on plaintiff.
