Adds new GS 163-82.10(d) allowing the exclusion from public inspection of a voter's address during the time a domestic violence protective order remains in effect, if the voter submits a copy of the order to the county board of elections along with a signed statement that the voter has good reason to believe that the physical safety of the voter or a member of the voter's family residing with the voter would be jeopardized if the voter's address were open to public inspection. The voter's address is available for inspection by a law enforcement agency or by a person identified in a court order, if inspection of the address by that person is directed by that court order.
