H 1215. CONSERVE WATER/PROMOTE GREEN ENERGY (NEW). Intro. 4/12/01. Senate committee substitute makes the following changes to 1st edition. Completely rewrites bill. Amends GS 143-355(1) to require local government local water supply plans to include current and future water conservation and water reuse programs. Amends GS 143-355(m) to require that the State water supply plan include a summary of water conservation and water reuse programs described in the local plans. Provides that the Environmental Management Comm'n develop, in consultation with specified representatives, permanent rules governing water conservation and reuse that establish minimum standards and practices. Establishes a goal to reduce water consumption by State agencies by at least 10%. Directs DENR to evaluate and report on certain water conservation measures implemented in the State and identify programs to foster conservation and reuse. Requires that the NC Utilities Comm'n include certain additional items in its study for the Comm'n on the Future of Electric Service in NC and provides for reporting of study results.

H 1215. CONSERVE WATER/PROMOTE GREEN ENERGY. Intro. 4/12/01. Senate amendment makes the following changes to 1st edition. Amends provision regarding Environmental Management Comm'n rules to require that the Comm'n develop and implement permanent rules governing water conservation and water reuse during drought and water emergency situations that establish minimum standards and practices for water conservation and reuse for certain users. Provides that in developing those rules, the Comm'n shall consult with certain water users and advocacy groups and that any rules shall not supercede or modify existing rules governing water used in the generation of electricity. Amends section pertaining to the NC Utilities Comm'n study to require that the Comm'n consider the impact of its recommendations on consumers of electricity.
