H 1471. BIOTERRORISM DEFENSE FUNDS. *AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS FROM THE GENERAL FUND AND TO AUTHORIZE THE GOVERNOR TO BORROW FUNDS FROM THE SAVINGS RESERVE ACCOUNT TO IMPLEMENT BIOTERRORISM DEFENSE MEASURES AND TO ADDRESS OTHER BIOTERRORISM ISSUES.* Appropriates \$1,900,000 for 2001-2002 from General Fund to Dep't of Crime Control & Public Safety to implement bioterrorism defense measures, which may include (1) purchasing materials and equipment, (2) training personnel, (3) developing operations plans that include use of alternate facilities within state government to protect critical state functions, and (4) equipping search and rescue teams. Requires the Sec'y of Crime Control and Public Safety and the Governor to report to the Joint Legislative Comm'n on Governmental Operations within 30 days of using funds.

H 1471. TERRORISM DEFENSE FUNDS. Intro. 10/30/01. House committee substitute makes the following changes to 1st edition. Expands allowed use of funds to terrorism defense measures (was, bioterrorism defense). Authorizes Governor to use up to \$30 million from Savings Reserve Account to implement defense measures against all forms of terrorism; Governor must take steps to repay account if funds become available to offset state's expenditures.
