H 1649. CHARLOTTE/DOUGLASS AIRPORT CONTRACTS. Intro. 6/13/02. Senate committee substitute adopted 8/13/02 makes the following changes to 1st edition. Adds a new section (which expires June 30, 2005) authorizing Johnston County to contract for the design and construction of water treatment plant expansion projects without being subject to the requirements of GS 143-128, 143-129, 143-131, and 143-133 (all related to bidding of public contracts) and GS 143-64.31 and 143-64.32 (related to procuring architectural, engineering, and surveying services). Changes bill's title to *AN ACT TO EXTEND THE EXPIRATION DATE OF A LOCAL ACT ALLOWING THE CITY OF CHARLOTTE TO CONTRACT WITH PRIVATE PARTIES FOR THE DEVELOPMENT, CONSTRUCTION, AND OCCUPANCY OF CHARLOTTE/DOUGLAS INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT SPECIAL USER PROJECTS AND TO AUTHORIZE JOHNSTON COUNTY TO CONSTRUCT WATER TREATMENT PLANT EXPANSION PROJECTS WITHOUT COMPLYING WITH ARTICLE 8 OF CHAPTER 143 OF THE GENERAL STATUTES.*
