H 442. CONCEALED HANDGUNS/RECIPROCITY. TO PROVIDE RECIPROCAL CONCEALED HANDGUN RIGHTS TO CONCEALED HANDGUN PERMIT HOLDERS OF OTHER STATES. Amends GS Ch. 14, Art. 54B, adding GS 14-415.24 providing that a valid concealed handgun permit or license issued by another state is valid in NC if the other state requires the appropriate background records checks and grants a reciprocal right to NC residents. Subsection (b) of the new provision requires the Attorney General to determine which states meet the specified requirements and to maintain and make available a registry of such states. Provides that GS 14-415.11(a) and (c) apply to a nonresident whose concealed handgun permit or license from another state is honored by NC in accordance with the reciprocity provisions. Subsection (b) is effective when the act becomes law. The Attorney General must implement subsection (b) within 60 days after the act becomes law. The remainder of the act becomes effective 60 days after it becomes law.
