H 609. WELL CONSTRUCTION STANDARDS/RULE MAKING. Intro. 3/14/01. House committee substitute makes the following changes to 1st edition. Completely rewrites bill so it now (1) provides that for a well serving a single-family dwelling where lot size or other fixed conditions preclude the separation distances specified in 15A NCAC 2C .0107, the required separation distances are to be the maximum possible, but in no case less than 50 feet for a septic tank and drainfield, 25 feet for a water-tight sewage or liquid-waste collection or transfer facility, 50 feet for animal barns, and 50 feet for cesspools or privies, (2) authorizes the Environmental Management Commission to make rules consistent with this act, and (3) changes the bill's title to *AN ACT TO SPECIFY THE MINIMUM SEPARATION DISTANCES BETWEEN A WELL SERVING CERTAIN SINGLE-FAMILY DWELLINGS AND CERTAIN OTHER STRUCTURES ON THE SAME LOT AND TO AUTHORIZE THE ENVIRONMENTAL MANAGEMENT COMMISSION TO INCORPORATE THOSE MINIMUM SEPARATION DISTANCES.* Effective retroactively to the date on which it is ratified.

SL 2001-113 (H 609). WELL CONSTRUCTION STANDARDS/RULE MAKING. *AN ACT TO SPECIFY THE MINIMUM SEPARATION DISTANCES BETWEEN A WELL SERVING CERTAIN SINGLE-FAMILY DWELLINGS AND CERTAIN OTHER STRUCTURES ON THE SAME LOT AND TO AUTHORIZE THE ENVIRONMENTAL MANAGEMENT COMMISSION TO ADOPT A TEMPORARY RULE TO INCORPORATE THOSE MINIMUM SEPARATION DISTANCES.*

Summarized in *Daily Bulletin* 3/14/01 and 4/18/01. Enacted May 24, 2001. This act is effective retroactively to the date on which it is ratified. If the Environmental Management Commission adopts a temporary rule as provided in Section 2 of this act, Section 1 of this act expires when the temporary rule becomes effective.
