H 834. RAISE WASHINGTON OCCUPANCY TAX-2. Intro. 3/28/01. House committee substitute makes the following changes to 1st edition. Provides that Authority must use at least 2/3 of net proceeds to promote travel and tourism and remainder for tourism-related expenditures. Limits amount that can be withheld as cost of administering the tax to 3% of first \$500,000 collected and 1 % of remaining gross proceeds collected each year (now, 5% of gross proceeds). Defines terms "travel and tourism" and "tourism-related expenditures."
