S 206. TOURIST DIRECTIONAL SIGN PROGRAM. TO ESTABLISH A TOURIST-ORIENTED DIRECTIONAL SIGN (TODS) PROGRAM. As title indicates, creates new GS Ch. 136, Art. 11B. Authorizes DOT to establish program in which eligible tourist-oriented businesses pay fees (to be defined by rule) for DOT to erect guide signs. Defines eligibility of businesses and sign content, describes when signs cannot be installed, and establishes when signs may be modified temporarily. Authorizes DOT to adopt rules implementing the TODS program. Specifies topics to be addressed by rules, including the requirement that TODS signs be limited to placement along highways other than fully controlled access highways and to rural areas in and around towns with a population of less than 25,000. Effective July 1, 2001.
