S 392. MATTHEW SHEPARD/INCREASE HATE CRIME PENALTY. TO HONOR THE MEMORY OF MATTHEW SHEPARD BY EXPANDING THE SCOPE OF THE HATE CRIME LAWS AND INCREASING THE CRIMINAL PENALTY FOR COMMITTING A HATE CRIME. GS 14-3(c) currently increases the offense class of misdemeanors that are committed because of the victim's race, color, religion, nationality, or country of origin. This bill makes GS 14-3(c) applicable to misdemeanors that are committed because of the victim's real or perceived race, color, religion, nationality, country of origin, gender, sexual orientation, disability, or age. Makes similar changes to GS 14-401.14 (ethnic intimidation) and GS 15A-1340.16(d) (aggravating factors considered in sentencing). Reclassifies offenses under GS 14-401.14 (ethnic intimidation) as a Class I felony (now, Class 1 misdemeanor). Enacts new GS 14-3(d) increasing the sentencing level for felonies that are committed because of the victim's real or perceived race, color, religion, nationality, country of origin, gender, sexual orientation, disability, or age. Defines sexual orientation under GS 14-3 as an emotional, physical, or sexual attachment to another person without regard to the sex of the person or an orientation for such attachment, or a self-image or expression not traditionally associated with one's biological maleness or femaleness. Applies to offenses committed on or after Dec. 1, 2001.
