S 402. SECRET PEEPING CHANGES. Intro. 3/12/01. House committee substitute makes the following changes to 1st edition. Changes bill and title to AN ACT TO MODIFY THE SECRET PEEPING STATUTE AND TO MAKE CONFORMING CHANGES. Amends GS 14-202 to make the offense apply to peeping secretly into any room occupied by another person (now, female) and to increase punishment as follows: Class A1 misdemeanor if done while in possession of device that may be used to create a photographic image and Class I felony if when peeper uses device to create photographic image of another person in that room for the purpose of arousing or gratifying the sexual desire of a person. Makes it a Class I felony to: (1) surreptitiously use a device to create a photographic image of another person underneath and through the clothing being worn by that person for purpose of viewing the body of, or the undergarments worn by, that other person; (2) surreptitiously install in a room a device that can be used to create a photographic image; (3) possess a photographic image that the person knows, or has reason to know, was obtained in violation of this law; (4) disseminate images that the person knows, or should have known, were obtained in violation of this act. Authorizes judge to require person convicted to register as a sex offender. Provides for civil cause of action against person who violates this act, including punitive damages and attorney's fees. Effective December 1, 2002, and applies to offenses committed on or after that date.
