S 408. MUNICIPAL ETJ ROADWAY IMPROVEMENTS. Intro. 3/12/01. House committee substitute makes the following changes to 1st edition. Completely rewrites bill so it now amends GS 160A-296 (which gives cities general authority and control over public streets) to provide that a city with a population of 500,000 may exercise the power to open new streets and to widen, extend, pave, clean, and otherwise improve streets, sidewalks, alleys, and bridges, and to acquire land therefore by dedication, purchase, or eminent domain, in its extraterritorial jurisdiction just as it can within its city limits, so long as the city has entered a memorandum of understanding with the Department of Transportation to provide for maintenance.
