**S 542. DATABASE ON PSYCHOTROPIC MEDS/CHILDREN.** TO DIRECT THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES TO REVIEW THE NEED FOR ESTABLISHMENT OF A STATEWIDE DATABASE ON THE ADMINISTRATION OF PSYCHOTROPIC MEDICATIONS TO CHILDREN WHO RECEIVE STATE SERVICES. Directs Dep't of Health and Human Services to review feasibility of establishing and maintaining database indicated in title. Requires report no later than Jan. 1, 2002, to Joint Legislative Health Care Oversight Committee and Joint Legislative Oversight Committee on Mental Health, Developmental Disabilities, and Substance Abuse Services.

**S 542. DATABASE ON PSYCHOTROPIC MEDS/CHILDREN.** Intro. 3/19/01. Senate amendment makes the following changes to 1st edition. Adds provision requiring Dep't of Health and Human Services to consider that any database developed must protect medical records and other privacy interests of minors for whom drugs are prescribed. Makes conforming change and provides that report shall give detailed information on how database will be maintained to protect medical records and privacy interests.
