If more than one lead jurisdiction participates, they share cost and duties jointly. Specifies procedure for preparing pilot (i.e., how to cross-reference to existing code) and sets out timetable for comment on proposed pilot code. Allows eligible local jurisdictions (jurisdictions whose inspection departments may do local plan review in accordance with Sec. 602.2.3 of State Building Code) to participate in pilot code by communicating their intent to Dep't and lead jurisdiction.
