Deletes proposed GS 18B-302(e1), which would have made it illegal to possess fraudulent identification while attempting to obtain alcoholic beverages. Amends GS 18B-302(e) to (1) add prohibitions on entering or attempting to enter place where alcoholic beverages are sold or consumed by using fraudulent identification and on obtaining or attempting to obtain permission to purchase alcoholic beverages by using fraudulent identification; and (2) add as a new form of fraudulent identification any form or means of identification that indicates or symbolizes that the person is not prohibited from purchasing or possessing alcoholic beverages.

**S 833. POSSESSING FALSE ID TO GET LIQUOR.** Intro. 4/3/01. House committee substitute makes the following changes to 2nd edition. Adds provision creating new GS 14-100.1 to prohibit possession or manufacture of fraudulent forms of identification. Offense applies to knowing possession or manufacturing of driver's license, photo ID cards issued by state agencies, military ID cards, passports, or alien registration cards with photos of person. Violation is Class 1 misdemeanor.
