**H 706. CHARLOTTE TRANSIT PROCUREMENT.** AMENDING THE CHARTER OF THE CITY OF CHARLOTTE TO ALLOW THE CITY TO PURCHASE APPARATUS, SUPPLIES, MATERIALS, OR EQUIPMENT FOR PUBLIC TRANSIT PURPOSES FROM PERSONS OR ENTITIES THAT HAVE RECENTLY MET STATE BIDDING LAW REQUIREMENTS AND PROVIDED APPARATUS, SUPPLIES, MATERIALS, OR EQUIPMENT TO THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT, STATE OF NORTH CAROLINA, OR ANOTHER STATE. As title indicates. Qualified contractors must have, within the previous 36 months after having completed a public formal bid process substantially similar to that required under GS Ch. 143, Art. 8, have contracted to furnish the apparatus, supplies, materials, or equipment to a unit or agency approved in GS 143-129(g). Qualified contractors must be willing to furnish the items at the same or more favorable prices, terms, and conditions as provided under the contract with the other unit or agency. Purchases must be approved by city council under GS 143-129(g).

**H 706. CHARLOTTE TRANSIT PROCUREMENT.** Intro. 3/27/03. Senate committee substitute makes the following changes to 1st edition. (1) Amends proposed new subsection (b) to Section 8.87 of the Charter of the City of Charlotte by extending to 60 months the time within which an outside contracting entity must have completed a public formal bid process or competitive proposal method to supply the same apparatus, supplies, materials or equipment to another unit or agency. (2) Amends GS 160A-610 by adding new subdivision (26) giving a regional public transportation authority the power to contract for the purchase, lease, or other acquisition of any apparatus, supplies, materials, or equipment for public transit purposes with any person or entity that has contracted to furnish the same to any unit or agency approved in GS 143-129(g) within the previous 36 months pursuant to a public formal bid process substantially similar to that required by Art. 8 of Ch. 143, , provided that the person or entity is willing to furnish the items at the same or more favorable prices, terms, and conditions as those provided under the contract with the other unit or agency. Any such purchases are to be approved by the authority's Board of Trustees.

**H** 706. CHARLOTTE TRANSIT PROCUREMENT. Intro. 3/27/03. Senate amendment makes the following changes to 2nd edition. Amends GS 160A-610(26) to authorize regional public transportation authorities to obtain public transit materials from any person or entity that successfully completed a public bid process for similar materials within the previous 60 (was, 36) months. Further provides that authorities may also contract with persons or entities that have successfully completed competitive proposal method under GS 143-129(h) for similar materials within previous 60 months.
