H 819. CAMPAIGNING OUTSIDE POLLS. Intro. 4/12/03. Senate committee substitute makes the following changes to 1st edition. Limits the size of the buffer zone in which no election-related activity takes place to no more than 50 feet. Adds subsection allowing Executive Director of the State Board of Elections to grant special permission to counties to use nonpublic buildings as voting places, on the condition that election-related activity not be permitted on their property adjacent to the buffer zone. To take advantage of this provision, specified findings must be made by the Executive Director. Changes effective date to Jan. 1, 2004.
