Provides that more stringent requirement applies in case of conflict or overlap between stormwater control requirement under Phase II or under any other water quality program. Sets out provisions for public entity that does not administer a Phase II permit within planning jurisdiction and whose jurisdiction includes urbanized area to submit stormwater management program for approval. Specifies how public entity may be designated as regulated entity. Sets out provisions for petitioning DENR to require owner of municipal separate storm system or person who discharges storm water to obtain Phase II permit. Provision regarding new development effective July 1, 2006; remainder of bill effective when it becomes
