Amends provisions of GS 86A-26 permitting unregulated barbering among members of same family to define a family member as a spouse, brother, sister, parent, grandparent, child, grandchild, mother-in-law, father-in-law, daughter-in-law, son-in-law, stepparent, or stepchild.
