Replaces first section of the bill, which amended GS 87-11(c), with new GS 87-15.3 providing that the identify of a complaining party may be kept confidential in the discretion of the Board until a time no later than the receipt of the complaint by the full Board for a disciplinary hearing. Changes amendment to GS 87-13.1 to delete the provision specifying that a violation that may be the subject of injunction must have occurred within the past three years.
