S 996. ABC-SEXUALLY EXPLICIT CONDUCT BANNED. Intro. 4/3/03. Senate committee substitute makes the following changes to 1st edition: (1) relegates findings concerning the adverse secondary effects of sexually explicit conduct in premises licensed to sell alcohol to preface of bill (recitation was included in new GS 18B-1005.1(a)); (2) provides that prohibitions do not apply to persons operating theaters, concert halls, art centers, museums, or similar establishments that are primarily devoted to the arts or theatrical performances, and are engaged in expressing a matter of serious literary, artistic, scientific, or political value (prior version did not refer to these expressions in establishments primarily devoted to the arts or theatrical performances); (3) provides that if any provision of the act is held invalid, the invalidity does not affect the other provisions; and (4) makes act effective when it becomes law (was, Dec. 1, 2003.)

S 996. ABC-SEXUALLY EXPLICIT CONDUCT BANNED. Intro. 4/3/03. House committee substitute makes the following changes to 2nd edition. Adds to proposed new GS 18B-1005.1(a)(2) as an offense "any act that includes or simulates the penetration, however slight, by an object into the genital or anal opening of a person's body," and deletes the catch-all offense that was new GS 18B-1005.1(a)(4) (any other lewd entertainment as defined by the Comm'n's rules).
