H 1034. STUDY SUCCESS CENTERS/NEW HANOVER SCHOOLS. REQUIRING THE NEW HANOVER COUNTY BOARD OF EDUCATION TO STUDY SUCCESS CENTERS BEFORE IMPLEMENTING THEM IN THE NEW HANOVER COUNTY SCHOOLS. As title indicates.

Requires that Board consider certain listed factors.

H 1034. ROCKINGHAM CO. SCHOOLS ELECTIONS (NEW). Intro. 3/31/05. House committee substitute deletes all provisions of 1st edition and substitutes provisions changing the manner of election of the Rockingham County Board of Education.

August 10, 2005

H 1034. ROCKINGHAM CO. SCHOOL ELECTIONS. Intro. 3/31/05. Senate committee substitute makes the following changes to 2nd edition. Provides that effective December 2006 until December 2008, the Rockingham County Consolidated Board of Education will consist of thirteen members, five elected at large and eight from single-member districts, and that effective December 2008 the Board will be reduced to eleven members, five elected at large and six elected from single-member districts. Establishes single-member district boundaries. Provides for four-year terms. Amends Section 2 of SL 1993-15 of the 1993 Session Laws to require that newly elected members take office on the first Monday in December following their election (was, second Tuesday).

August 11, 2005

H 1034. ROCKINGHAM CO. SCHOOL ELECTIONS. Intro. 3/31/05. Senate amendment makes the following changes to 3rd edition. Provides that if vacancy occurs on Rockingham County Consolidated Board of Education before December 2008 election, Rockingham County Board of Education will nominate one or more people for each vacancy, and Rockingham County Board of Commissioners may not appoint someone not nominated by Board of Education.

SL 2005-307 (H 1034). ROCKINGHAM COUNTY SCHOOL ELECTIONS. AN ACT TO CHANGE THE MANNER OF ELECTION OF THE ROCKINGHAM COUNTY BOARD OF EDUCATION. Summarized in *Daily Bulletin* 6/1/05, 8/10/05, and 8/11/05. Enacted August 23, 2005. Effective August 23, 2005.
