H 1104. BAN CELL PHONE USE WHILE DRIVING. TO MAKE USING A MOBILE PHONE UNLAWFUL WHILE DRIVING A MOTOR VEHICLE ON A PUBLIC STREET OR HIGHWAY. Enacts new GS 20-140.6 as title indicates. Creates a rebuttable presumption that driver who holds a mobile telephone in the immediate proximity of his or her ear is engaging in a call, and makes violation of section an infraction punishable by a fine of \$100 and court costs, but no assessment of points. Creates exceptions for the use of a mobile telephone in emergency situations or by law enforcement, fire dep't, or ambulance personnel, and for the use of a handsfree mobile telephone (except that persons under 18 years old may not operate a hands-free mobile telephone while operating a motor vehicle). Prohibits the passage of local ordinances regulating mobile telephone use. Applies to offenses committed on or after December 1, 2005. Intro. by McAllister.
