H 1305. MAPS/CHARTERS TO SEC. OF STATE. REQUIRING CITIES TO FILE CERTIFIED CHARTERS AND BOUNDARY MAPS AND COUNTIES TO FILE CERTIFIED BOUNDARY AND TOWNSHIP MAPS WITH THE SECRETARY OF STATE. As title indicates. Amends GS 160A-22 (city clerk to file certified map showing boundaries of city), GS 160A-111 (city clerk to file certified true copy of city's charter), GS 153A-17 (county manager, or chair of county comm'rs if no manager, to file certified map showing boundaries of county), and GS 153A-19 (county manager, or chair of county comm'rs if no manager, to file certified map showing boundaries and names of all townships within county) to require officials to file on or before July 1, 2006, with Secretary of State the information in parentheses current as of January 1, 2006, and thereafter on or after July 1 of year preceding each decennial federal census with information current as of January 1. H 1305. MAPS/CHARTERS TO SEC. OF STATE. Intro. 4/20/05. House committee substitute makes the following changes to 1st edition. Modifies GS 160A-22 to require that on or before December 1, 2006 (was, July 1, 2006), the city clerk file a certified map showing the boundaries of the city as of January 1, 2006. Deletes proposed GS 160A-111(a) and transfers requirement that city file charter by January 1, 2006 (was, July 1, 2006), to new GS 160A-22(d). Deadline for filling of charter is December 1, 2006, for cities with a population of 1,000 or more and December 1, 2007, for all other cities (was, July 1, 2006, for all cities). Deletes requirement that city also file charter before each census. Provides that filed charter may not be offered as evidence of charter in any administrative or judicial proceeding. Deletes proposed GS 153A-19(d) which would have required that counties file a map showing township boundaries. Requires that Secretary of State consult with various listed organizations before adopting rules for maps submitted by city and county clerks. Makes technical changes.
