H 1415. PISTOL PERMIT/CHECK WITH HOME COUNTY SHERIFF. *TO PROVIDE THAT IF A PERSON WHO APPLIES FOR A PISTOL PERMIT HAS AN OUT-OF-COUNTY ADDRESS, THE SHERIFF SHALL CONSULT*

WITH THE SHERIFF OF THE APPLICANT'S HOME COUNTY REGARDING THE APPLICANT PRIOR TO ISSUING THE PERMIT. Amends GS 14-404(a) as title indicates. Effective October 1, 2005.

H 1415. REPORT DENIAL OF SOME PISTOL PERMITS (NEW). Intro. 4/21/05. House committee substitute replaces all provisions of 1st edition with *AN ACT TO PROVIDE THAT DENIAL OF A LICENSE OR PERMIT TO PURCHASE A PISTOL SHALL BE REPORTED TO THE STATE BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION TO BE ENTERED INTO AN APPROPRIATE COMPUTERIZED DATABASE THAT IS ACCESSIBLE TO SHERIFFS STATEWIDE.* Effective December 1, 2005, enacts new GS 14-401.1 as title indicates. Lists information that must be provided by sheriff to SBI and requires that SBI enter information into an appropriate database within 24 hours of receipt. Establishes procedures for removal of information from database if person successfully appeals permit denial. Requires that SBI identify a database accessible to all sheriffs by October 1, 2005, and notify each sheriff of database within 10 days after database is identified.

H 1415. REPORT DENIAL OF SOME PISTOL PERMITS. Intro. 4/21/05. House amendments make the following changes to 2nd edition. Amendment #3 adds new subsection (a1) to new GS 14.404.1, requiring a sheriff to notify the State Bureau of Investigation when the sheriff obtains firearms, ammunition, and permits to purchase or carry firearms pursuant to a surrender under GS 50B-3.1, so that certain information can be entered into a state database. Amendment #3 also conforms the title and makes other conforming changes. Amendment #1 (1) makes new GS 14-404.1 effective September 1, 2005 (was December 1, 2005); (2) requires SBI to identify an appropriate computer database for noting permit denials and firearm or permit surrenders by September 1, 2006 (was October 1, 2005); and (3) provides that information noted in the database is automatically deleted 8 years after the date of entry. Amendment #2 increases from 24 to 72 hours the time frames for the sheriff and the SBI to respond to a written request to remove a notation from the database when a person has successfully appealed the denial of a permit.
