H 1428. DISTRICT JUDGE RETENTION ELECTIONS. Intro. 4/21/05. House committee substitute makes the following changes to 1st edition. Revises proposed amendment to Section 10 of Article IV of the North Carolina Constitution to specify that a district judge defeated in a retention election may not be appointed to a vacancy in that office until four years from the end of the term. Requires that General Assembly provide procedure for determining a successor to a district judge who does not seek retention. Enacts new GS 163-329.1 setting forth procedures for district judge retention elections. Makes conforming amendments to GS 163-1(d) and GS 7A-140. Statutory amendments and new GS 163-329.1 effective for elections held in 2008 or thereafter, pending voter approval of constitutional amendment.
