H 1486. FELONY DEATH BY VEHICLE. TO PROVIDE FOR FIRST AND SECOND DEGREE FELONY DEATH BY VEHICLE. Amends GS 20-141.5 to denominate current offense of felony death by vehicle as second-degree felony death by vehicle and increase punishment from Class G to Class E felony. Creates new offense of first-degree felony death by vehicle punishable as Class I felony. New offense contains all elements of second-degree felony death by vehicle and additionally requires state to prove one of seven specified factors: (1) gross impairment of the defendant's faculties or alcohol concentration of 0.16 or more at relevant time after driving; (2) aggressive driving under GS 20-141.6; (3) violation of GS 20-28 (driving while license revoked) or 20-28.1 (moving violation during revocation); (4) one or more DWI convictions during seven years before current offense; (5) violation of GS 20-141.5 (speeding to elude arrest); (6) violation of GS 20-141 (speeding) involving speed at least 30 m.p.h. over speed limit; or (7) violation of GS 20-217 (passing stopped school bus). Effective December 1, 2005, and applicable to offenses committed on or after that date.

H 1486. FELONY DEATH BY VEHICLE. Intro. 4/21/05. House committee substitute makes the following changes to 1st edition. Revises two aggravating factors that make offense first degree felony death by vehicle: a violation of GS 20-28 or 20-28.1 if the revocation was an impaired driving revocation; and a violation of GS 20-141.5(b) (speeding to elude arrest) if the violation is a felony. Eliminates three aggravating factors: aggressive driving under GS 20-141.6, a violation of GS 20-141 involving speeding at least 30 mph over the speed limit, and a violation of GS 20-217. Makes first degree felony death by vehicle a Class E felony (was, Class I) and second-degree felony death by vehicle a Class G felony (was, Class E).
