Amends Section 3 to make the City of Fayetteville responsible for establishing the minimum standards for employment as a Civilian Traffic Investigator (was, the NC Department of Justice, Division of Criminal Justice Education and Training Standards). Amends Section 4 to require each Civilian Traffic Investigator to attend a training session designed by the Fayetteville Technical Community College, Office of Protective Services Training (was, training session designed by NC Department of Justice, Division of Criminal Justice Education and Training Standards).

H 2041. CIVILIAN TRAFFIC INVESTIGATORS. Filed 5/16/06. House committee substitute makes the following changes to 2nd edition. Requires Fayetteville Technical Community College to consult with the North Carolina Justice Academy in designing the civilian traffic investigator training program. Deletes the requirement that law enforcement officers who assist with field training be certified traffic investigators. Specifies that uniforms issued to civilian traffic investigators must display the individual's name and clearly identify the individual as a civilian traffic investigator. Deletes provision making an assault on a civilian traffic investigator a violation of GS 14-33(c)(4). Adds new section requiring the City of Fayetteville to report to the General Assembly on the training and use of civilian traffic investigators.
