H 779. INCREASE THE PENALTY FOR TRUANCY (NEW). Intro. 3/17/05. House committee substitute makes the following changes to 1st edition. Deletes all provisions of first edition, which increased the compulsory attendance age, and replaces it with AN ACT TO INCREASE THE PENALTY FOR AIDING AND ABETTING A STUDENT'S UNLAWFUL ABSENCE FROM SCHOOL. Amends GS 115C-380 (compulsory school attendance for public schools) and GS 116-235(b)(2) (compulsory attendance for the School of Science and Math) to increase penalty for violation of those sections from a Class 3 to a Class 1 misdemeanor.
