H 855. REQUIRED REGISTRATION FOR KEGS. TO REQUIRE A SPECIAL PURCHASE-TRANSPORTATION PERMIT FOR KEGS CONTAINING ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES. Amends GS 18B-403 to require a permit for the purchase and transportation of draft beer in kegs. Provides for the affixing of labels to kegs containing: (1) the name and address of the purchaser, (2) the purchase-transportation permit number, and (3) the address of the location where the keg is to be consumed. Requires that the label remain affixed to the keg and that a store employee who receives a keg returned without its label notify the NC Alcohol Law Enforcement Div'n or local law enforcement.

Imposes \$5 fee for keg permit. Expands purchase-transportation permit-disqualifiers to include conviction of any offense involving a violation of GS 18B-302. Permits local ABC board to request a certified copy of a criminal history check to ensure compliance and makes cost of check responsibility of applicant. Permits county sheriff to issue purchase-transportation permit if no local ABC system exists.

Makes violation of the keg permit requirement a Class 1 misdemeanor and requires revocation of a violator's driver's license pursuant to GS 20-17.3. Provides for a minimum mandatory \$1,000 fine and a 3-year license revocation upon a subsequent conviction. Effective December 1, 2005.

H 855. CHILD NUTRITION STANDARDS (NEW). Intro. 03/22/05. House committee substitute deletes all provisions of 1st edition and replaces it with AN ACT DIRECTING THE STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION TO ESTABLISH STATEWIDE NUTRITION STANDARDS FOR SCHOOL MEALS, A LA CARTE FOODS AND BEVERAGES, AND THE AFTER SCHOOL SNACK PROGRAM ADMINISTERED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION AND CHILD NUTRITION PROGRAMS OF LOCAL SCHOOL ADMINISTRATIVE UNITES, AS RECOMMENDED BY THE STUDY COMMITTEE FOR CHILDHOOD OVERWEIGHT/OBESITY OF THE HEALTH AND WELLNESS TRUST FUND. Enacts new GS 115C-264.2 as title indicates. Requires that prior to statewide implementation, nutrition standards will be implemented in pilot programs in a minimum of eight middle and eight high schools and that the Child Nutrition Services Section of the Dep't of Public Instruction oversee the pilot programs and report annually on the progress of each local school administrative unit in achieving the nutrition standards to the State Board of Education and to the Joint Legislative Education Oversight Committee.
