S 254. SCH. CALENDAR FLEX. AFTER HURRICANE FLOODING. TO GIVE FLEXIBILITY IN THE SCHOOL CALENDAR TO ACCOMMODATE EXTRAORDINARY CIRCUMSTANCES CAUSED BY HURRICANES FRANCES AND IVAN. Amends GS 115C-84.2(a)(1) to provide that local boards of education must adopt a school calendar that includes a minimum of either 180 days or 1,000 hours of instruction (was, a minimum of 180 days and 1,000 hours of instruction). Provides that if board schedules 1,000 hours of instruction in less than 180 days, teachers employed for a 10-month term and all other employees will be compensated as if they had worked 180 instructional days. Effective for 2004-05 school year only and applicable to local school administrative units located in counties that were declared a federal disaster area as the result of Hurricanes Frances and/or Ivan and that have missed more than 10 instructional days due to inclement weather and flooding caused by those hurricanes.
