S 41. CRIMINAL RECORDS CHECKS/LTC CHANGES. *TO MAKE CHANGES TO THE PROCEDURE FOR CONDUCTING NATIONAL CRIMINAL HISTORY RECORDS CHECKS FOR LONG-TERM CARE FACILITIES TO CONFORM WITH FEDERAL REQUIREMENTS, AS RECOMMENDED BY THE NORTH CAROLINA STUDY COMMISSION ON AGING.* GS 122C-80(b), 131D-40(a) and 131D-40(a1), and 131E-265(a) and (a1) require that area mental health, developmental disabilities and substance abuse authorities, adult care homes and their contractors, and nursing homes or home care agencies and their contractors, conduct national criminal history records checks on certain non-licensed applicants. Act amends those sections to require that the results of national criminal history requests be returned to the Criminal Records Check Unit (was, Div'n of Facility Services) and to provide that Unit can inform employer only if information received may affect the employability of applicant. Although sections previously allowed disclosures of the results of national criminal history record checks to employer, act specifically prohibits such disclosures.
