Current GS 14-34.1 makes it a Class E felony to discharge a barreled weapon or firearm into occupied property. Act amends statute to provide that if property is (1) a dwelling or (2) a conveyance traveling on public street or vehicle area, waterway, or airspace, then offense is a Class B2 felony if serious injury to any person results, and is otherwise a Class C felony. Effective for offenses committed on or after December 1, 2005.

Makes it a Class C felony to discharge weapons into moving railroad cars that are occupied. Makes it a Class B2 felony if discharging a weapon into any occupied building or conveyance results in serious injury (was, made it a B2 felony only if serious injury resulted from the discharge of a weapon into an occupied dwelling or moving conveyance). Makes technical changes.

Makes violation of GS 14-34.1(a) or (b) a class C felony (was, class B2) if violation results in serious bodily injury (was, serious injury).
