H 1060. LOCAL GOVERNMENT SURPLUS PROPERTY DONATIONS. Filed 3/26/07. *AUTHORIZING CITIES AND COUNTIES TO DONATE SURPLUS, OBSOLETE, OR UNUSED PROPERTY TO OTHER GOVERNMENTAL UNITS OF THE STATE.* Enacts new GS 160A-280 providing that a city or county may donate real or personal property that the governing board deems to be surplus, obsolete, or unused to another governmental entity as defined by GS 160A-274(a). Requires the governing board of the city or county to (1) give public notice of the intended donation, and (2) adopt a resolution approving the donation before distributing the property.

H 1060. LOCAL GOVERNMENT SURPLUS PROPERTY DONATIONS. Filed 3/26/07. House committee substitute makes the following changes to 1st edition. Modifies the catchline of the new GS 160A-280 from *Donations of personal property to other local governments* to *Donations of personal property to other governmental units* to be consistent with the content of the bill. Requires that the public notice be given at least five days before the resolution is adopted. Specifies that the authority granted to a governmental unit under the statute is in addition to any authority granted under any other provision of law.

H 1060. LOCAL GOVERNMENT SURPLUS PROPERTY DONATIONS. Filed 3/26/07. Senate amendment makes the following changes to 2nd edition. Rewrites the bill to (1) authorize only cities (was, cities and counties) to donate property under the act and (2) expand authorized donees under the act to include any governmental unit within the United States, a sister city, or a nonprofit organization incorporated by the United States, the District of Columbia, or a state. Defines *sister city* for purposes of the statute. Rewrites title to reflect expansion of donees but not to reflect deletion of counties from coverage of the act.
