H 1369. PRESCRIPTION ORDERS/ELECTRONIC IMAGE. Filed 4/5/07. PERTAINING TO THE PRESERVATION OF PRESCRIPTION DRUG ORDERS BY PHARMACIES.

Current law requires every pharmacist-manager of a pharmacy to maintain for a minimum of three years the original of every prescription order and refill compounded or dispensed at the pharmacy except for prescription orders recorded in a patient's medical record. Amends GS 90-85.26 to allow a pharmacy to comply with this requirement by maintaining an electronic image of a prescription order or refill in lieu of a hard copy, if the pharmacy's computer system is capable of providing information required under the North Carolina Pharmacy Practice Act to the Board of Pharmacy within 48 hours after a request for information.

H 1369. PRESCRIPTION ORDERS/ELECTRONIC IMAGE. Filed 4/5/07. Senate committee substitute makes the following changes to 1st edition. Amends GS 90-85.26 to clarify that the pharmacy's computer must be capable of providing the required information in an electronic or paper format. Amends GS 90-106(h) to require a pharmacist dispensing a controlled substance to enter the date of dispensing on the prescription order and removes the requirement that the pharmacist sign the prescription. Amends GS 90-412(a) to remove the provision requiring the preservation of a hard copy of a consent to treatment or authorization to disclose medical record information and requiring a notation of the existence of the information in the electronic record. Makes a conforming title change.
