H 1824. PROMOTE LOW IMPACT DEVELOPMENT. Filed 4/18/07. TO PROMOTE THE USE OF LOW IMPACT DEVELOPMENT TO REDUCE STORMWATER RUNOFF.

Defines *low impact development* as a stormwater management and land development strategy that uses natural features and small engineered controls to limit post-development runoff to that similar to pre-development conditions. Directs that these low impact practices be used to the maximum extent practical in stormwater management regulations within the twenty coastal counties subject to the Coastal Area Management Act. Directs the Department of Transportation to adopt low impact standards for subdivisions and private roads that will connect to the stormwater management systems of state roads. Directs the Department of Environment and Natural Resources to incorporate low impact development practices in its manuals and model ordinances.

Deletes waiver of Express Review Program permit fees for projects utilizing low-impact development practices.
