H 2121. JACKSON ROAD HUNTING. Filed 5/14/08. TO PROHIBIT HUNTING FROM, ON, OR ACROSS THE RIGHT-OF-WAY OF A PUBLIC ROAD OR HIGHWAY IN JACKSON COUNTY, WITH CERTAIN EXCEPTIONS.

Prohibits actual or attempted hunting, taking, or killing, with the use of firearms, of any birds or animals other than bear or boar, from, on, or across the roadway or right-of-way of a public road or highway. Also generally prohibits the discharge of a firearm from, on, or across a public road. Makes an exception for an owner or lessee of land adjoining the public road. Makes the first violation of the law a Class 3 misdemeanor and a second or subsequent violation a Class 2 misdemeanor. Provides that enforcement is by law enforcement officers of the Wildlife Resources Commission, by sheriffs and deputy sheriffs, and by peace officers with general subject matter jurisdiction. Applies to Jackson County only. Effective October 1, 2008 for acts committed on or after that date.

Makes changes by deleting language and clarifying that it is unlawful to kill (was, hunt, take, or kill or attempt to hunt, take, or kill) any wild animal or bird (was, any species of birds or animals other than bear or boar) by using a firearm, or to discharge a firearm, from, on, or across the right-of-way of an improved state maintained road, street, or highway (was, public road or highway). Makes technical changes.
