The 1st edition proposed a cap of \$15,000 in aggregate over the duration of the estate on the value of an incompetent ward's tangible personal property that a guardian or general guardian for the incompetent ward could sell without a court order. Amendment #1 deletes the \$15,000 cap.

Amendment #2 changes the effective date of the bill to October 1, 2008 (was, when the act becomes law).
