H 444. UNC BD OF GOVERNORS/ELECTION PROCEDURE. Filed 3/1/07. *TO ESTABLISH THE PROCEDURE FOR NOMINATING AND ELECTING MEMBERS OF THE BOARD OF GOVERNORS OF THE UNIVERSITY OF NORTH CAROLINA.*

Sets schedule for nomination process for the eight seats to the UNC Board of Governors to be elected by the House of Representatives. Nominations must be submitted by a Representative during the week of March 12-16, 2007. Directs the North Carolina State Ethics Commission to screen candidates and submit a slate of possible candidates that does not exceed twice the number of seats to be elected. Specifies election procedure, including date (no later than April 3, 2007) and method to conduct runoffs and to break ties. Each Representative voting must vote for as many candidates as there are vacancies to be filled by that election, and ballots must be signed and made available for public inspection.

H 444. HOUSE UNC BOG ELECTION PROCEDURE. Filed 3/1/07. House committee substitute makes the following changes to 1st edition. (1) Changes the date by which every person who has been formally nominated for the Board of Governors (BOG) must file a completed North Carolina State Ethics Commission Statement of Economic Interest (Statement of Economic Interest) from March 16, 2007, to March 23, 2007. (2) Provides that the election of the eight persons as members of the BOG by the House of Representatives is provisional subject to the NC State Ethics Commission's evaluations of the Statements of Economic Interest of those persons.

H 444. HOUSE UNC BOG ELECTION PROCEDURE. Filed 3/1/07. House amendment makes the following changes to 2nd edition. Amends the procedures for nominating and electing members of the UNC Board of Governors to specify that the slate of legally qualified candidates lists, and that the ballot includes, 16 candidates if 16 or more have been nominated (was, lists no more that twice the number of candidates for the total seats open).
