**S 1271. FIREFIGHTER/EMS PAYROLL DEDUCTIONS.** Filed 3/21/07. *TO PROVIDE PAYROLL DEDUCTIONS FOR CERTAIN EMERGENCY MEDICAL PERSONNEL.*

Provides that a public safety employer must make a payroll deduction upon the request of the employee for the membership dues of any firefighter and emergency services personnel organization that represents a majority of eligible employees in the department.

**S 1271. FIREFIGHTER/EMS PAYROLL DEDUCTIONS.** Filed 3/21/07. Senate committee substitute makes the following changes to 1st edition. Codifies in GS 153A-92.1 and GS 160A-162.1 the language from the original bill and adds law enforcement officers. Provides that a law enforcement employer must make a payroll deduction for membership dues on an officer's request for a law enforcement organization or association with at least 2,000 members statewide. Provides that an authorization for payroll deduction by any of the covered employees must be in writing and remains in effect until revoked.

**S 1271. FIREFIGHTER/EMS PAYROLL DEDUCTIONS.** Filed 3/21/07. Senate amendment makes the following changes to 2nd edition. Modifies proposed GS 153A-92.1 and GS 160A-162.1 to require a written authorization for the payroll deduction for dues each time there is an increase in the amount.

**S 1271. FIREFIGHTER/EMS PAYROLL DEDUCTIONS.** Filed 3/21/07. Senate committee substitute makes the following changes to 3rd edition. Modifies proposed GS 153A-92.1 and proposed GS 160A-162.1 as follows: (1) changes the definition of *employee* to a county officer or employee paid by the county; (2) defines *employer* as any county or political subdivision of the state, removing the separate definitions of *employer or public safety employer* and *employer or law enforcement employer*; (3) requires an employer to make a payroll deduction upon the request of the employee for the membership dues of an employee organization or association that has at least 2,000 members statewide, including at least 500 law enforcement officers; (4) requires the authorization for the deduction to be in a signed writing; and (5) removes the requirement for written authorization each time there is an increase in the amount of the membership dues deduction.
